

Township Resolution

At a town board meeting of Green Valley Township In Becker, County, Minnesota held on the 4th day of October, 2005 at 8 o'clock p.m. at the town hall in said township, Supervisor Aaron Skaro introduced and moved the adoption of the following resolution, which was seconded by Supervisor Lowell Skoog, and unanimously adopted by the town board of supervisors:


WHEREAS, Green Valley Township in Becker County, Minnesota has been holding fair and honest local elections in Minnesota for over 150 years without Federal interference.

WHEREAS, The cost of programming the equipment for a local election would be between \$700-\$1000. Since the average voter participation in local township elections is about 25--30, the cost far outweighs the benefits.

WHEREAS: The township board of supervisors has determined it to be in the best interest of the township , the public and all parties concerned That Minnesota already has statutes defining procedures for handi-capped voting, Federal interference is not needed.

THEREFORE: The Green Valley Townboard of Supervisors recommends that the Minnesota Legislature grant permanent exemption from HAVA for local township elections.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That Green Valley Township Unanimously adopted the above resolution on October 4th, 2005.
