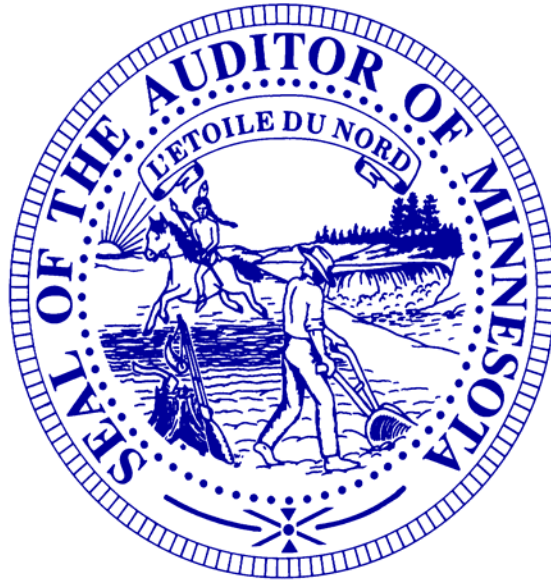

Description of the Office of the State Auditor

The Office of the State Auditor serves as a watchdog for Minnesota taxpayers by helping to ensure financial integrity, accountability, and cost-effectiveness in local governments throughout the state.

Through financial, compliance, and special audits, the State Auditor oversees and ensures that local government funds are used for the purposes intended by law and that local governments hold themselves to the highest standards of financial accountability.

The State Auditor performs approximately 250 financial and compliance audits per year and has oversight responsibilities for over 4,300 local units of government throughout the state. The office currently maintains five divisions:

Audit Practice - conducts financial and legal compliance audits for local governments;

Government Information - collects and analyzes financial information for cities, towns, counties, and special districts;

Legal/Special Investigations - provides legal analysis and counsel to the Office and responds to outside inquiries about Minnesota local government law; as well as investigates allegations of misfeasance, malfeasance, and nonfeasance in local government.

Pension Oversight - monitors investment, financial, and actuarial reporting for over 700 public pension funds;

Tax Increment Financing (TIF) - promotes compliance and accountability in local governments' use of TIF through financial and compliance audits;

The State Auditor serves on the State Executive Council, State Board of Investment, Land Exchange Board, Public Employee's Retirement Association Board, Minnesota Housing Finance Agency, and the Rural Finance Authority Board.

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Scope and Methodology of Report

This report shows the costs of lobbying services provided to Minnesota local governments and their associations. The report is prepared in accordance with Minnesota Statutes §6.76, which states:

"(a) On or before January 31 of each year, all counties, cities, school districts, metropolitan agencies, regional railroad authorities, and the metropolitan council shall report to the state auditor, on forms prescribed by the auditor, their estimated expenditures paid for the previous calendar year to a lobbyist as defined in section 10A.01, subdivision 21, except payments to associations of local governments that are reported under paragraph (b), and to any staff person not registered as a lobbyist, over 25 percent of whose time is spent during the legislative session on legislative matters.

(b) Associations of local governments subject to this section shall report annually, on or before January 31, to the state auditor and the association's members the proportionate amount of each member's dues spent for lobbying purposes."

In addition to collecting the information prescribed in Minnesota Statutes §6.76, the Office of the State Auditor has begun requiring local governments and their associations to report more detailed information regarding the billing practices of those hired to provide lobbying services, and other costs related to lobbying services such as administration and overhead. The change was made because the definition of “lobbyist” and “lobbying” in Minnesota Statutes and Rules were different, and resulted in wide variances of what was reported as an expenditure on lobbying services.¹ The State Auditor’s concern was that local governments and their associations were understating the true costs of their lobbying effort because they were excluding overhead, administration, and other costs related to lobbying services. The revised instructions and forms first introduced for the 2003 period reflect the inclusion of the definitions of lobbyist and lobbying set forth in statute and rules.²

The Office of the State Auditor has collected and published data on the lobbying services costs of local governments since 1989. This is the seventh year that associations whose membership includes local governments were required to report their lobbying services expenditures to the State Auditor. Because of the inclusion of local government associations, the data presented in this report are not comparable with reports prior to the 1997 report. This report summarizes expenditures on local government lobbying services during calendar year 2005³ and is intended to inform Minnesota citizens and policy makers of the amount spent by their local governments to attempt to influence public policy in the state.

The reporting forms used to collect information on the expenditures by local governments and their associations for lobbyists and lobbying are presented as appendices in this report. The list of local government associations was developed by reviewing a list of all associations that were registered with the Campaign Finance and Public Disclosure Board. While the Auditor's Office attempted to identify all associations of local governments and provide them forms to fulfill their reporting requirement, it is the associations' responsibility to comply with the reporting requirement. The expenditures on lobbying services are the amounts self-reported by local governments and local government associations.

Local Government Lobbying Services in 2005

Summary of 2005 Local Government Expenditures on Lobbying Services

According to reports filed with the Office of the State Auditor, local governments spent a total of \$7,786,360 on lobbying activities in 2005. This represents an increase of \$1,527,571 or 24.4 percent from the amount spent in 2004.

Local government lobbying expenditures increased 24.4 percent between 2004 and 2005.

Eighty-three reporting local governments (nineteen more than in 2004) directly employed or hired contract lobbyists in 2005. These local governments spent a total of \$3,667,943 on staff and contract lobbyists. This was \$725,539 or 24.7 percent more than in 2004. Staff and contract lobbyists are paid to influence legislative, administrative, or official action of governmental units in Minnesota. These expenditures do not include dues and membership fees paid to local government organizations.

In addition to the \$3.7 million paid directly to staff and contract lobbyists, local governments paid dues of \$9,517,627 in 2005 to local government associations (hereinafter referred to as associations) that also represented their interests before the legislature. These dues represent an expenditure of taxpayer dollars.⁴ These associations spent \$4,118,417 on lobbyists and lobbying in 2005. This represents an increase of 24.2 percent over 2004. Of the \$4.1 million spent on lobbyists and lobbying, \$3,540,058 was funded exclusively through dues. This represents an increase of 28.3 percent over the \$2,759,343 in association dues that was spent on lobbying activities in 2004.

Payments Made to Staff and Contract Lobbyists

Eight-three of Minnesota's cities, counties, school districts, and metropolitan agencies directly employed staff and/or contracted with professional lobbyists to represent their interests before the legislature. Tables 1 through 3 detail these lobbying expenditures.

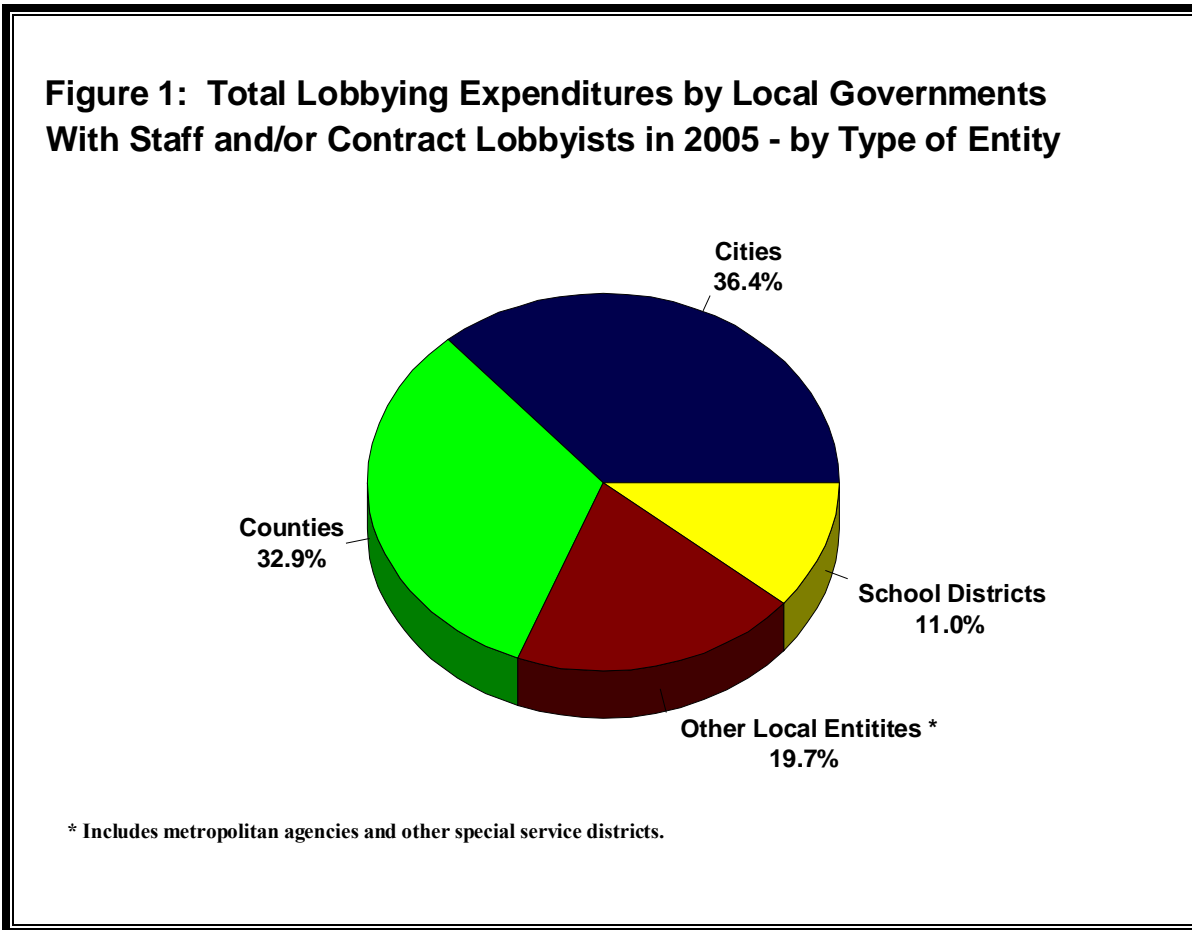
Of the 83 entities reporting to have had employed lobbying staff or hired contract lobbyists in 2005:

- Thirty-four cities and city component units reported a combined total of \$1,335,258 in lobbying services expenditures. This compares to 23 cities and \$1,008,049 in 2004.
- Seventeen counties and county component units reported a combined total of \$1,207,428 in lobbying services expenditures. This compares to 20 counties and \$1,118,044 in 2004.
- Thirteen education entities reported a combined total of \$402,743 in lobbying services expenditures. This compares to 14 entities and \$395,464 in 2004.
- Nineteen metropolitan agencies and other special districts reported a combined total of \$722,514 in lobbying services expenditures.⁵ This compares to 7 agencies and \$420,487 in 2004.

⁵The State Auditor made a concerted effort to collect lobbying information from special districts in 2005. As a result, the number of entities in this category reporting lobbying costs jumped from 7 in 2004 to 19 in 2005.

Local Governments Spending the Most on Staff and Contract Lobbyists

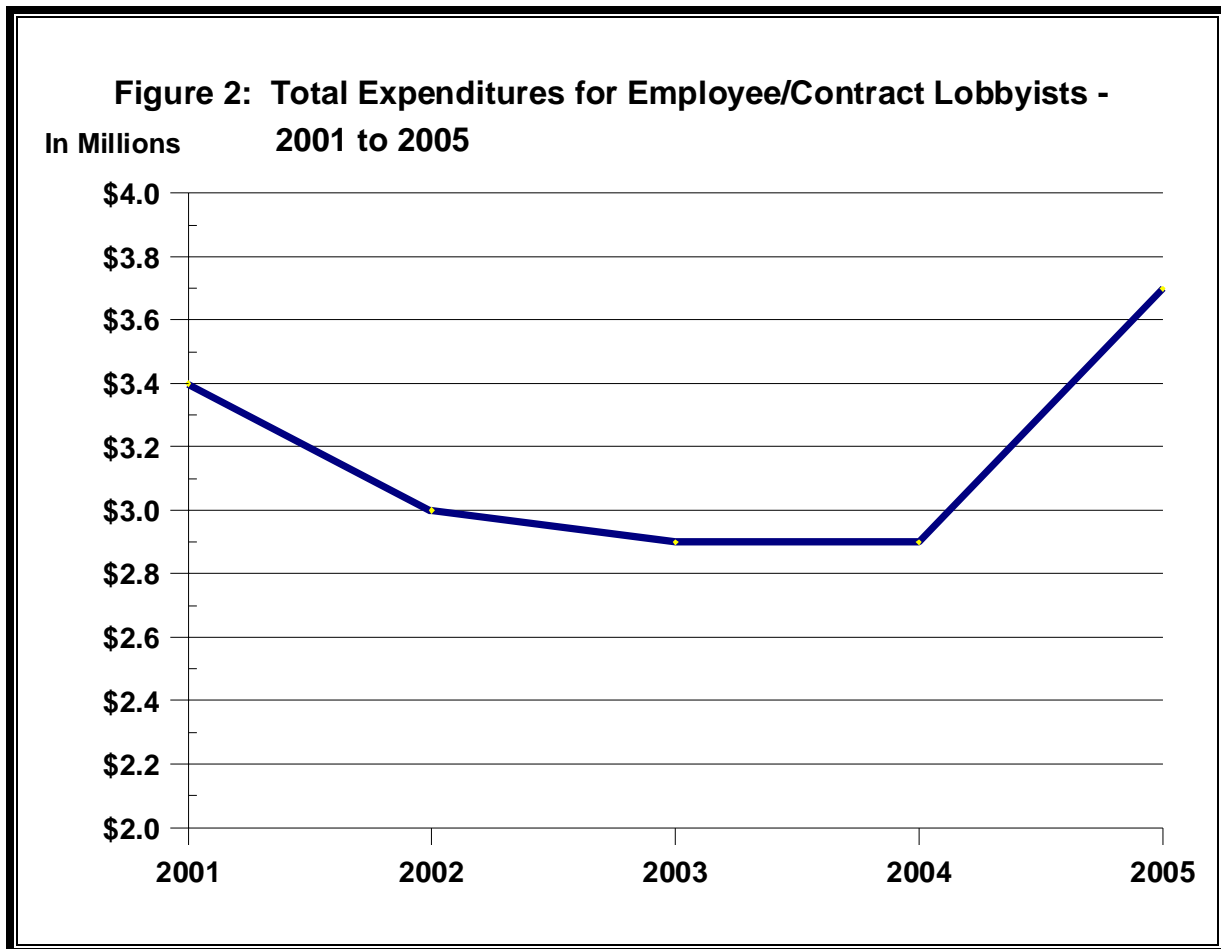
Nine of the 83 local governments that directly employed lobbying staff or hired contract lobbyists reported over \$100,000 in lobbying services expenditures for a total of \$1,659,435. These nine local governments accounted for 45.2 percent of the total amount paid to contract and staff lobbyists in 2005. The nine local governments are:

Trends in Expenditures for Staff and Contract Lobbyists

The number of entities that reported expenditures on contract and staff lobbyists went from 64 in 2004 to 83 in 2005. The increase in the number of entities reporting employee/contract lobbying expenditures was a factor in expenditures rising 24.7 percent between 2004 and 2005. The greater number of days in the 2005 regular and special sessions may have also contributed to the increased lobbying expenditures.⁶ The increase was a significant reversal of trends over the previous four years.

Figure 2 shows expenditures on staff and contract lobbyists for the years 2001 to 2005.



Reliance on Contract Lobbyists

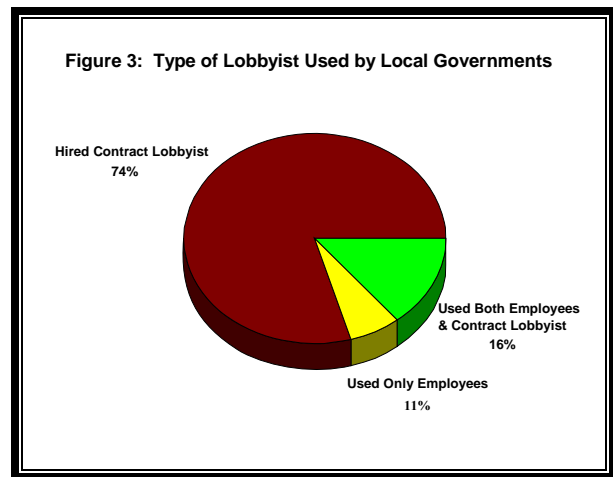
It was more common for local governments to use contract lobbyists than to have their own staff provide lobbying services. Contract lobbyists accounted for \$2,432,589 or 66.3 percent of the total amount spent by those governments using contract or staff lobbyists. Local governments spent \$1,126,964 on employee lobbyists to represent the local government's interests before the legislature

and other governmental bodies. In addition, local governments reported an additional \$108,390 in overhead costs related to lobbying services.

During 2005:

- 9 local units of government relied entirely upon their employees to represent them at the legislature;
- 61 units of government relied entirely upon contract lobbyists to represent their interests; and,
- 13 local units of government hired contract lobbyists and used their own employees for lobbying the legislature.



Lobbying Services Expenditures by Associations of Local Governments

While 83 local governments opted to hire lobbyists or use employees to lobby on their behalf, most local governments relied on various local government organizations to represent their interests at the legislature.⁷ These local government organizations receive the majority of their funding from membership dues and other public funds. Some associations representing local governments not only lobby on behalf of their members, but also act as service organizations. Groups such as the League of Minnesota Cities and the Association of Minnesota Counties provide a wide range of services to their members. For these associations, lobbying services account for a smaller share of their overall expenditures.

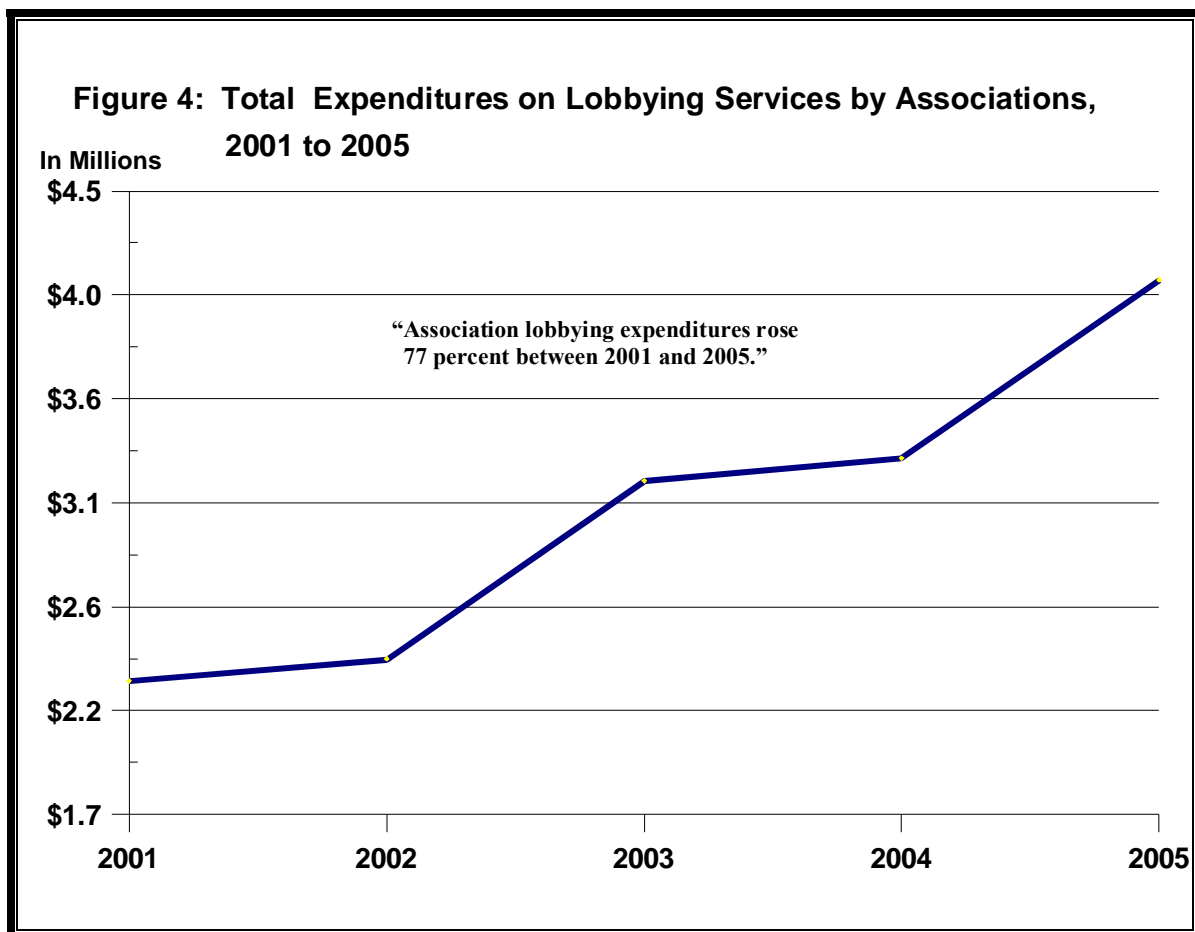
Other associations are formed for the explicit purpose of lobbying the legislature on a specific issue or range of issues for which the members share a common interest. Most of these associations hire a lobbyist or a lobbying firm to influence legislative, administrative, or other official actions at the state, regional or metropolitan level of government. The dues paid by members of these associations generally represent a percentage of the total amount paid to a contracted lobbyist. While it is expected that most member dues from these arrangements will be used for lobbying, some associations reported that less than ten percent of dues were used for lobbying services.

Trends in Expenditures on Lobbying Services by Associations of Local Governments

Twenty-nine associations representing local governments reported expenditures on lobbying services totaling \$4,118,417 for 2005. Of the \$4.1 million spent on lobbying, \$3,540,058 or 86.0 percent was funded through the dues of the association members. Total expenditures for lobbying/lobbyists by associations increased \$802,032 or 24.2 percent over 2004.⁸ Expenditures on lobbying/lobbyists by associations have risen 77 percent in five years. Some of the growth may reflect the efforts of the State Auditor to better define lobbying activities.

Figure 4 shows expenditures on lobbying services by associations for the years 2001 to 2005.



Association Lobbying by Type of Entity

The associations reporting lobbying expenditures included:

- Seven organizations that represented the interests of cities;

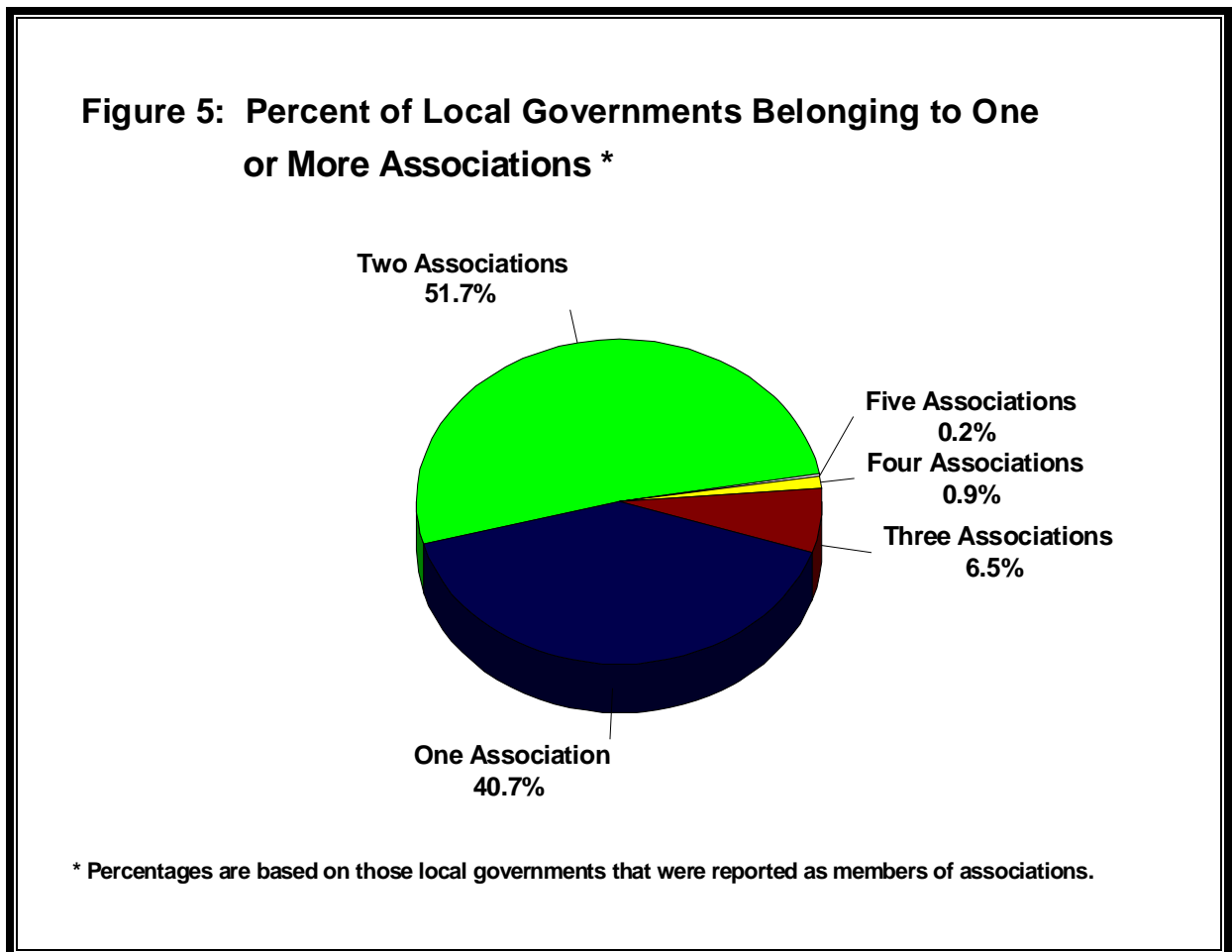

- Four organizations that represented the interests of counties;
- Four organizations that represented the interests of school districts;
- One organization that represented the interests of townships;
- Two organizations that represented other local government interests; and
- Seven organizations that represented more than one type of local government.

Many Local Governments Belong to Multiple Associations

While it is common for local governments to belong to at least one association, some local units belong to several. There were 106 local units of government (8 percent) that paid dues to three or more associations. While there are no restrictions regarding the number of associations to which local governments may belong, good fiscal policy would dictate that local governments evaluate whether they are receiving overlapping services.

Figure 5 details the distribution of local government memberships to associations.

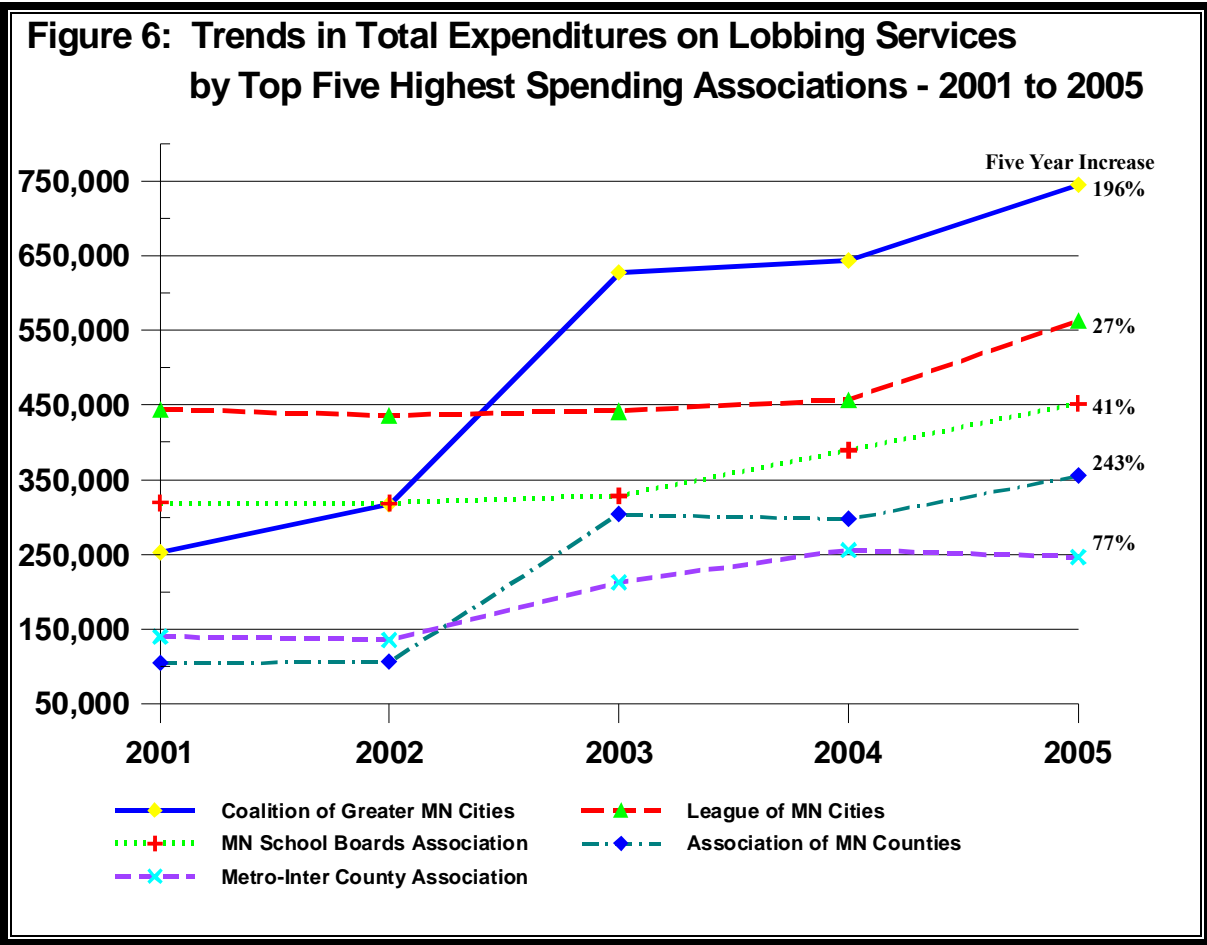


Associations with the Highest Expenditures on Lobbying Services

Among the 29 local government organizations that lobbied the legislature on behalf of their local government members, thirteen organizations reported expenditures on lobbying/lobbyists in excess of \$100,000.

The organizations that reported total lobbying expenditures exceeding \$100,000 in 2005 were:

Compensation Paid to Firms or Employees for Lobbying and Non-Lobbying Services

In 2005, Minnesota local governments or associations of local governments paid 12 firms \$100,000 or more to provide lobbying and other services. The 12 firms receiving the largest payments from local governments or associations of local governments were:

Compensation Paid to Firms for “Non-Lobbying” Activities

Several firms, in addition to lobbying services, billed their clients substantial additional amounts for “non-lobbying” services. For example, Flaherty and Hood billed local governments and their associations \$936,510 in lobbying services and an additional \$532,534 in “non-lobbying” services for a total of \$1,469,045. Messerli and Kramer billed \$221,063 in lobbying services and an additional \$84,180 in “non-lobbying” services for a total of \$305,243. These payments paid to lobbying/law firms that are designated as “non-lobbying” expenditures may represent a possible understatement of lobbying/lobbyist expenditures.

Expenditures on Lobbying Services by Associations May be Understated

While there has been an improvement in reporting compliance, there may still be an understatement of the true costs of lobbying efforts. An examination of contracts and billing records of several associations found that many activities classified as “non-lobbying” were in fact part of the lobbying effort.⁹ There appears to be a significant difference in the calculation of costs incurred depending upon how the definition of “lobbying” is interpreted when reporting costs to this office, and how a “lobbyist” is defined under Minnesota Statutes depending whether or not the lobbyist is an employee of a political subdivision.¹⁰ The Auditor’s Office believes that the standard for reporting lobbying costs should include all the expenses incurred for activities that support lobbying and lobbyists to better show the actual costs of the lobbying effort.

Conclusion

The State Auditor is very concerned by the skyrocketing lobbying costs from 2004 to 2005. In the role as watchdog for Minnesota taxpayers, it is the State Auditor’s responsibility to examine how taxpayer dollars are spent. Some find it troubling that local governments spend taxpayer dollars in hopes of securing more taxpayer dollars. The lobbying activities of local governments and associations of local governments are an oversight concern because these entities are funded with taxpayer dollars. In its examination of local government lobbying services, the State Auditor has identified some areas of concern.

The State Auditor’s Office believes that because taxpayer dollars are involved, the public has an inherent interest in knowing the amount spent by associations of local governments to influence public policies. The State Auditor would strongly argue that all spending of those associations primarily organized to provide lobbying services furthers the lobbying effort. However, many

associations appear to still be excluding activities that contribute to the furtherance of the lobbying effort. The public should know the full costs of activities used to support lobbying services.

The Office of the State Auditor believes that local governments have a right to have their interests, and the interests of their citizens, represented at the legislature and other bodies of government. However, local governments would be well served to evaluate the amount they are spending on these activities. Like all other governmental services, lobbying activities must be evaluated against the other priorities of the local government.

Recommendations

In July of 2005, the State Auditor's Office issued a report entitled, "Supplemental Report on the Lobbying Costs of Local Government Associations." This report detailed the billing practices and possible underreporting of lobbying costs by several associations. In addition, the report identified areas of concern including a lack of competitive bidding or requests for proposals (RFP's) when hiring firms utilized in lobbying efforts, minimal internal controls in some cases, and using highly compensated staff to perform administrative functions. Based on those findings and evidence of the same issues in the current reporting period, the State Auditor makes the following recommendations:

Contracting

The State Auditor recommends that associations of local governments review the structure of their organization to determine if it would be more cost effective to hire full or part-time employees to perform the administrative and/or lobbying duties than to contract with lobbying firms. If the association decides to use contract lobbyists, it should solicit several bids to ensure that it receives the best value for its dollars. The following section outlines things to consider.¹¹

- 1.) Local governments and their associations should answer the following questions before hiring an outside firm or consultant to perform lobbying duties:
 - Are there current employees capable of performing the job? If there are not current employees to do the work, could someone be hired to perform the work at a lower cost than a consultant? Could staff of one of the association members perform some of the duties at a lower cost?
 - Are there alternatives to hiring an outside consultant, such as an advisory task force, or similar consultant work on similar problems for other governmental entities?
 - What is the nature of the problem for which a hired lobbyist is necessary?
 - Could the duties to be performed be split into different contracts? For example, if part of the duties includes setting up meetings or conferences, updating web pages, or computer programming work, could contracts for these duties be written separately? Non-lobbying charges totaling over \$100,000 by firms hired to lobby may indicate excessive administrative expenses.
 - Could the decision to hire a consultant be justified to taxpayers?

2.) If, based in part to the answers to the previous questions, the entity decides to hire a firm or consultant, the process to choose the individual or firm should involve competitive bids or RFP's. The RFP process can ensure that multiple vendors are given the opportunity to bid on the contract. Competition should lead to lower costs and better service.

Internal controls

The State Auditor's Office recommends that the governing boards of associations develop and implement strong internal control policies and procedures. Internal controls are practices and processes that organizations use to protect assets from loss or misuse. It is important for associations of local governments to implement the same types of internal controls that their members are required to use in their own activities. Areas of weakness identified in the supplemental report included:¹²

- A lack of written policies and procedures;
- A lack of pre-numbered receipts;
- A lack of a detailed review of invoices;
- Only the treasurer's signature on associations checks; and
- Association boards not approving all disbursements.

Internal control policies should be adequate to ensure that:

- 1.) Transactions are properly authorized.
- 2.) Duties are properly segregated. This means that no person should be in a position to commit an irregularity and then conceal it. Examples of incompatible duties that should be performed by separate individuals are:
 - Receipting collections, posting collections to registers, and making bank deposits;
 - Signing checks and reconciling the bank accounts. Pre-signing checks and using signature stamps defeat these controls.
 - Receipting collections and posting collections to the accounts receivable records; and
 - Approving receivable write-offs/write-downs and posting adjustments to the accounts receivable records, adjusting accounting codes, and reviewing the monthly detailed report of receipts and disbursements for accuracy.
- 3.) Accounting records and documentation are properly designed and maintained. Accounting records need to be complete. Key documents such as receipts and checks should be sequentially numbered. Voided documents should be retained.
- 4.) Access to both assets and records is controlled.
- 5.) Accounting data are periodically compared with the underlying items they represent. Bank statements should be routinely reconciled with the cash balances recorded in the books of the account. Check amounts should be compared with the claims approved, as recorded in the minutes.

Expenses related to lobbying

Expenses related to lobbying include reimbursements to the employee for items such as travel, food, and the cost of materials.

Amount billed for Non-Lobbying Services is the amount, in dollars, that the lobbyist billed for non-lobbying services (rounded to the nearest dollar). Non-lobbying services include any additional amount billed by the lobbyist to the association that is not clarified in lobbying services.

Total Amount Billed by Lobbyist should equal the total amount, in dollars, billed to the association by the individual lobbyist. This should be the sum total of lobbying services and non-lobbying services.
