### FILLMORE COUNTY REVIEW AND STATUS OF 2024 PERFORMANCE MEASURES

2024 Performance Measure 1) Reduce the total number of accidents that occur on County State Aid Highways, County Roads and Un-Organized Township Roads that involve fatalities and injury from prior year:

For 2024, the County had 2 fatalities and 28 injuries for the crashes. We did achieve this goal as we had 2 less fatalities this year and 1 less injury.

### 2024 Performance Measure 2) Maintain Pavement Quality Index rating of 2.8:

The County reached this goal with the PQI being at 2.9 for 2024, this was a decrease of .08 from 2023.

### 2024 Performance Measure 3) Tobacco use among adults to be lower than national benchmark:

This performance measure was not reached for 2024 as the National performance measure was 15%, the State of Minnesota was 14% and Fillmore County was at 18%. Fillmore County's use was same percentage in 2023.

### 2024 Performance Measure 4) Child Support Program Cost Effectiveness – goal of \$6.00:

This goal was not reached in 2024, Fillmore County collected \$5.57 for every \$1.00 spent on the child support program. We are ranked  $5^{th}$  in the state. This is above the state average of \$2.65. In 2023, we collected \$4.57 which is an increase of \$1.00 for every \$1.00 spent on the child support program, we went from  $17^{th}$  in the state to  $5^{th}$ !

## 2024 Performance Measure 5) Percentage of low birth-weight births to be lower than national benchmark:

As in the past, this performance measure was reached and is surprisingly good for the high number of pregnant women not receiving prenatal care and delivering babies at home. We are at 5%, the national percentage (8%) and the state percentage (7%). This is the same result as 2023.

# 2024 Performance Measure 6) Median ratio between 90% and 105% for three types of assessment ratios:

This performance measure was reached for two of the types, however Fillmore County was not compliant for Commercial/Industrial classification in 2024:

#### 2024 Performance Measure 7) Meet 10-day turn-around time for document recording:

This performance measure was reached for 2024.

#### 2024 Performance Measure 8) 100% post-election results:

This performance measure was reached for 2024.

## 2024 Performance Measure 9) Increase by 5% State and Federal dollars brought into County for veterans' benefits:

The VA has not produced the 2024 Geographic Distribution of VA Expenditures (GDX) Report and Fillmore County is not able to obtain the data until the report is Published. For 2023, we did not reach the goal but still had a 1% increase in benefits.

### 2024 Performance Measure 10) Maintain 85% of veterans receiving services and/or benefits:

Fillmore County does have at least 85% of Veterans receiving services and/or benefits.

### 2024 Performance Measure 11) Goal of 5000 visits per 1000 residents for annual library visits:

For 2024, 4,398 was the number of physical library visits per 1,000 residents. We did not meet the goal of 5,000, however in 2023 there were 4,167 visits so we have increased our visits. Additionally, Website visits were at 3,775.

### 2024 Performance Measure 12): Goal to keep debt service levy under 10%:

The debt service levy was at 3.98% for 2024. Which is up from 2023, which was 2.12% based on new debt (jail) replacing the paid off old debt (2003/2010 remodel/reissue). Per capita for the debt service levy is \$24.65.

### 2024 Performance Measure 13) Performance Measure of 35% recycling rate of Municipal Solid Waste:

The recycling rate for 2024 was 32%, which is up from 2023 which was 31%. We did not reach our goal; however, we did improve.
