PERFORMANCE MEASUREMENT PROGRAM**

WHEREAS, pursuant to the requirements of 2010 Minnesota Laws Chapter 389, Article 2, Sections 1 and 2 ("2010 Law"), the Minnesota State Legislature developed a Performance Measurement Program that is voluntary for counties and cities; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to the 2010 Law, the Council on Local Results and Innovation submitted a recommended standard set of 'Model Performance Measures For Counties' (Exhibit A), a copy of which are on file in the office of the Anoka County Administrator; and,

WHEREAS, there are direct financial impacts for participation in this program; and,

WHEREAS, participation in the Performance Measurement Program will allow the county to be better prepared for enhanced or expanded performance measurement initiatives from the State of Minnesota; and,



(a) Data on Life Expectancy come from the National Center for Health Statistics (NCHS) through the National Vital Statistics System (NVSS). The most recent data available are two to four years prior to the reporting date, and are therefore estimates of the current Life Expectancy at birth.

(b) There are multiple family and system related factors that can affect the maltreatment recurrence performance measure. Our Federal Standard for this is to be less than 9.1%. The state average is 9.0%. Factors could include but not limited to: specific type of allegations being reported, efforts to decrease placement, increased drug use by families etc.



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
