WHEREAS, In 2010, the Minnesota Legislature created the Council on Local Results and Innovation; and
WHEREAS, The Council on Local Results and Innovation developed a standard set of performance measures that will aid residents, taxpayers, and state and local elected officials in determining the efficacy of counties in providing services and measure residents' opinion of those services; and
WHEREAS, Benefits to Fillmore County are outlined in MS 6.91 and include eligibility for a reimbursement as set by State statute; and
WHEREAS, Any county participating in the comprehensive performance measurement program is also exempt from levy limits for taxes, if levy limits are in effect; and
WHEREAS, The Fillmore County Board has adopted and implemented at least 10 of the performance measures, as developed by the Council on Local Results and Innovation, and a system to use this information to help plan, budget, manage and evaluate programs and processes for optimal future outcomes; and
NOW THEREFORE LET IT BE RESOLVED THAT, Fillmore County will report the results of the performance measures to its citizenry by the end of the year through publication, direct mailing, posting on the county's website, or through a public hearing at which the budget and levy will be discussed and public input allowed.
BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, Fillmore County will submit to the Office of the State Auditor the actual results of the performance measures adopted by the county/city.

REVIEW AND STATUS OF 2022 PERFORMANCE MEASURES

2022 Performance Measure 1) Reduce the total number of accidents that occur on County State Aid Highways, County Roads and Un-Organized Township Roads that involve fatalities and injury from prior year:

For 2022, the County had 1 fatality, it was on a US Highway. The County had a total of 31 injuries as follows: 12 on County roads; 7 on US Highways; 3 on State Highways; 6 on Township Roads and 3 on City Streets.

Comparing statistics from 2022 to 2021; 2022 had 1 less fatality and 14 less injuries than 2021

2022 Performance Measure 2) Maintain Pavement Condition Index rating of 72:

For 2022, the PCI rating of 72 was reached, Fillmore County had a rating of 72. We did not reach this goal in 2021 as we were at 70.

2022 Performance Measure 3) Tobacco use among adults to national benchmark:

This performance measure was not reached for 2022 as the National performance measure was 16%, the State of Minnesota was 15% and Fillmore County was at 19%. The percentage did decrease 1% from 2021.

2022 Performance Measure 4) Child Support Program Cost Effectiveness – goal of \$7.00:

This goal was not reached in 2022, Fillmore County collected \$4.40 for every \$1.00 spent on the child support program. This is above the state average of \$3.31, however we changed the goal to be \$7.00 or more. In 2021, we collected \$6.12 for every \$1.00 spent on the child support program.

2022 Performance Measure 5) Percentage of low birth-weight births:

As in the past, this performance measure was reached and is surprisingly good for the high number of pregnant women not receiving prenatal care and delivering babies at home. We are at 5%, the national percentage (8%) and the state percentage (7%). This is the same result as 2021.

2022 Performance Measure 6) Median ratio between 90% and 105% for three types of assessment ratios:

This performance measure was reached for all three types as follows:

2022 Performance Measure 7) Meet 10 day turn-around time for document recording:

This performance measure was reached for 2022.

2022 Performance Measure 8) 100% post-election results:

This performance measure was reached for 2022.

2022 Performance Measure 9) Increase by 5% State and Federal dollars brought into County for veterans benefits:

Fillmore County benefits increased by 17.5% in 2022. In 2021 there was a 1% decrease.

2022 Performance Measure 10) Maintain 85% of veterans receiving services and/or benefits:

Fillmore County does have at least 85% of Veterans receiving services and/or benefits.

2022 Performance Measure 11) Goal of 5000 visits per 1000 residents for annual library visits:

For 2022, 3,927 was the total library visits per 1,000 residents, this is actual in library visits and contactless visits. There were 15,367 website visits per 1,000 residents. In 2021, there were 3,421 visits per 1,000 residents, but there were 17,009 website visits per 1,000 residents.

The Board reduced the goal for 2022 due to being unable to reach the goal of 7500.

2022 Performance Measure 12): Goal to keep debt service levy under 11%:

The debt service levy was at 2.26% for 2022. Per capita for the debt service levy is \$12.73.

2022 Performance Measure 13) Performance Measure of 35% recycling rate of Municipal Solid Waste:

The recycling rate for 2022 was 30% which was up from 2021 which was 30.99%.
